ALPAR-Serving Alaska for 35 years

Keeping Alaska Beautiful! ALPAR's mission comes into focus every spring and summer. Hundreds of volunteers with yellow ALPAR litterbags are picking up litter along highways, trails and in our neighborhoods. ALPAR Youth Litter Patrollers are cleaning roads, beaches and parks and Alaska's recyclers and the recycling centers that serve them are doing more to turn waste into resources.

Behind the scenes, ALPAR's shipping partners, Matson Navigation Company Alaska, TOTE Maritime and Lynden Inc. support all these efforts through their substantial donations of shipping services to move recyclables to Seattle. The value to our recycling system is over \$3 million annually.

In addition, Lynden Transport, Alaska West Express, Weaver Brothers, United Freight and the Alaska Railroad donate trucking and rail services to move recyclables within the state. Without the on-going support of all these shipping companies, freight costs would be a barrier to recycling in

For 35 years, ALPAR has been the conduit for making this unique partnership work for Alaska's communities. Everyone benefits through economically viable recycling and litter programs across Alaska. Through the shipping donations, ALPAR is able to assist recycling centers from the Kenai Peninsula to Anchorage, the MatSu and Fairbanks.

ALPAR also partners with local governments including the Municipality of Anchorage Solid Waste Services, Kenai Peninsula Borough,

Fairbanks North Star Borough and the MatSu Borough.

For 15 years, BP has been our sole sponsor of the ALPAR/BP litterbag program. With help from Pepsi, we send over a quarter million free litterbags to every community in the state. ConocoPhillips provides safety vests for our Youth Litter Patrol Program.

Northern Air Cargo and the airlines of the Alaska Air Carriers Association support the Flying Cans and Flying Bottles recycling program for rural communities off the road system.

ALPAR and our partners are proud of our continuing work to make a difference for a beautiful, recycling Alaska!

Why do we recycling only plastic bottles, jugs and film at drop-off?

Plastic #1 PET bottles, #2 plastic bottles and jugs as well as plastic bags and film are only accepted at drop off in Anchorage. The main reason is that these materials are more valuable than NON-Bottles. Additionally, bottles and jugs have different chemical compositions than buckets and tubs even if they have the same resin #. The recycling center must choose the most valuable materials to keep recycling free and sustainable. NEW this year: #1 PET clear plastic clamshells/salad/berry containers can now go in CURBSIDE CARTS ONLY along with plastic bottles and jugs. In order to retain value, no other #'s of non- bottles! Anchorage's curbside is sorted by machine in Seattle.

RECYCLABLE ITEMS ACCEPTABLE AT CURBSIDE:


- · Aluminum and Steel Food Cans: Empty and rinse, labels OK
- #1 PET bottles, clamshells, cups, salad containers
- #2 HDPE jugs and bottles ONLY caps ok, empty
- · Cardboard: Flatten to fit into container
- Mixed Paper: Newspaper, magazines, junk mail, copy or colored paper, soft cover books, egg cartons, cereal boxes, paper bags, glossy paper



NOT ACCEPTABLE AT CURBSIDE:

Glass Plastic bags Green or Food waste Scrap metal Electronics Milk/Juice cartons Paper plates Paper napkins

Paper cups Plastic buckets/tubs /garden pots Plastic yogurt containers Bakery containers Aerosol cans Paint or Fuel cans Waxed cardboard




